

## Admissions Requirements for Exchange Students

### Step 1: Home Institution Nomination

Participants must be nominated by their home institution in order to apply. Send inquiries and nomination to: oge@stockton.edu.

### Step 2: Submit Exchange Application

- Application for DS-2019
- College/university transcripts (academic records)
- English proficiency (minimum score): TOEFL (79 iBT) or IELTS (6.0) or PTE (50) or Duolingo (105) or ELS (level 112) Waived for students from English speaking countries
- Financial support documents
- Copy of passport biographical page

**Fall semester: September - December**

**Spring semester: January - May**

**Application Deadlines**  
**Fall:** March 15  
**Spring:** October 15

#### Health Insurance & Immunizations

All exchange visitors (J-1) and their dependents (J-2) are required by the U.S. Department of State to have medical insurance coverage for their duration of stay with the following minimum benefits:

- Medical benefits of at least \$100,000 per accident or illness
- Repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000
- Expenses associated with the medical evacuation of the exchange visitor to his or her home country in the amount of \$50,000
- A deductible not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness.
- A policy must be underwritten by an insurance carrier with:
  - an AM Best rating of "A-" or above
  - an Insurance Solvency International, Ltd (ISI) rating of "A-I" or above
  - a Standard and Poor's Claims Paying Ability rating of "A-" or above
  - or a Weiss Research, Inc. rating of "B+" or above

#### Required & Recommended Immunizations:

- Meningitis (Required if living in on-campus housing)
- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (Recommended)
- Hepatitis B (Recommended)
